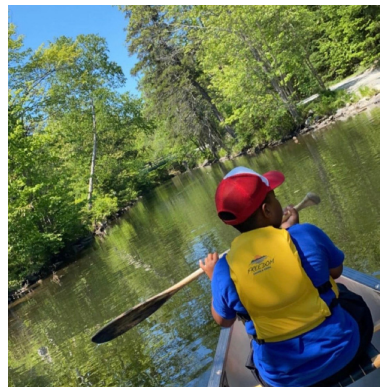
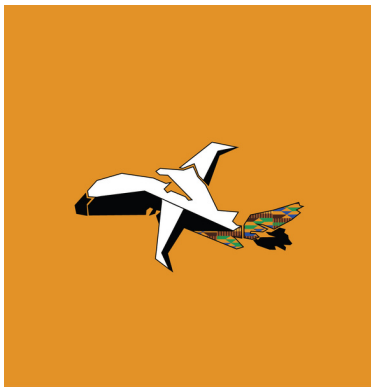

African Nova Scotians are a historically excluded racial group who have been living in Nova Scotia for over 400 years.

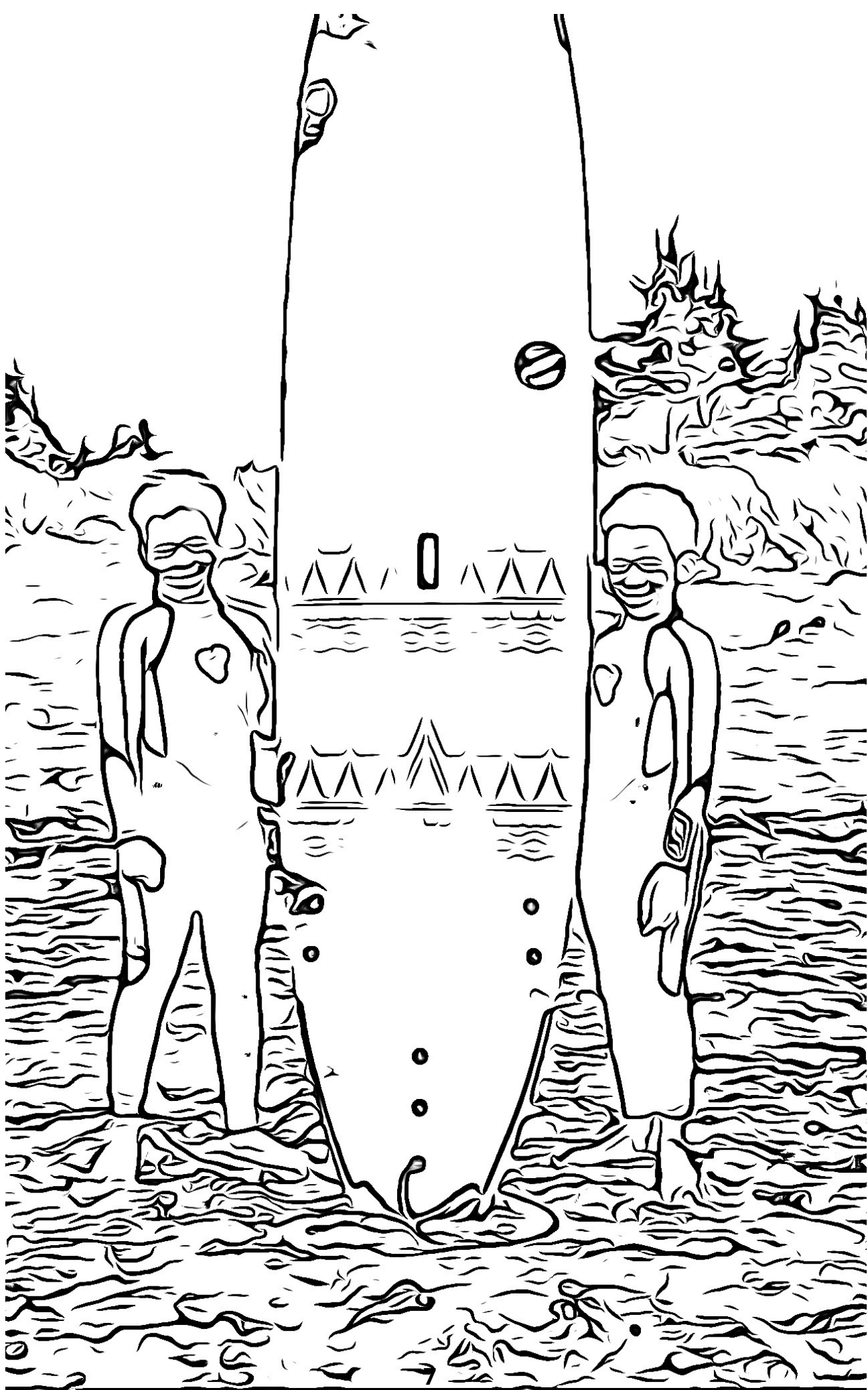
